

The “Roaring Twenties” WebQuest

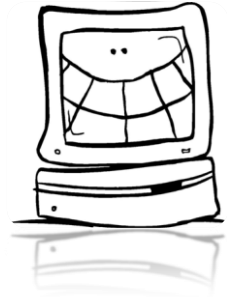
